

BETA BLOCKER INFORMATION

Beta Blockers are a class of drugs that block substances in your body such as adrenaline (epinephrine).

We ask that on the day of your testing that you **DO NOT** take your Beta Blocking medication due to the very unlikely chance that you may develop a reaction. In that case we would administer epinephrine to you. You may, however, take your medication at the completion of your appointment. Here is a list of common Beta Blocking medications, please inform us if you take any of the medications or *ophthalmic solutions* listed below:
